



Senator Toni Boucher Speaks to The Westport Woman's Club about Connecticut's New Biennial State Budget

Senator Boucher, a member of the General Assembly's Finance, Revenue & Bonding Committee discussed the details of the new biennial state budget.

The Senator spoke about the Legislature's Budget Process including General Fund Revenue and Major Budget Components for 2010 and touched on topics such as taxes, spending and healthcare.

Senator Toni Boucher was elected to represent the 26 Senatorial District in 2008 after having served as the State Representative from the 143rd Assembly District for 12 years.
