Announcing ... a new social group for members called Girls Night Out, or GNO!

What is it? A regularly scheduled week night evening social for members. This group is the result of a brainstorming session attended by 12 members on January 19, 2011.

The goal of GNO is to provide an opportunity, at a convenient time, for our members who work during the day, as well as any members who want to connect with others, to mingle socially while enjoying some food and wine.

When is it? Girls Night Out, or GNO, will be held on the first Wednesday of the month at the Clubhouse, starting at 6:30PM. Here are the dates for the next three months: March 2 - RSVP by 2/23 to clarec@optonline.net April 6 ; May 4 .

How does it work? Each attendee will pay \$10.00 in cash to attend each evening and will RSVP via email or sign up board so we know how much food to purchase. A member will be the treasurer and keep track of both fees and reimbursement.

Our menu will be kept simple to start – finger foods, heavy appetizers, wine and non-alcoholic beverages. Members of the group will pair up and be responsible for purchasing food and drinks for each meeting on a rotating basis. We will use paper goods and plastic cups

Since the goal is social, we will start with an ice breaker and maybe a game to foster conversation and laughs. We will include a WWC update of happenings/needs etc. at each evening. Our belief is that as the group evolves and grows there will be other ideas/ways to spend the evening like:

exploring co-hosting an evening with the Westport Library for speakers on topics of interest to us – apparently this idea comes from the Library; bowling; going to a restaurant; having a movie discussion where members would independently see a movie in advance and then meet to discuss while socializing; wine tasting - either from a merchant or we pick a varietal and each bring a bottle.

We are currently evaluating revenue and expenses for rolling the show into a cabaret series. It has just taken place at the time of this writing, so our review is not complete, but the cabaret is generating enthusiastic support and shows signs of making a meaningful contribution to the WWC's revenue stream.
