The Art of Living the Role - Albert Pia



At our February Club day, **Philip Anthony DiConstanzo** and his special guests will give an interactive presentation about the teachings of acting coach, teacher, and director, Albert Pia entitled: **"The Art of Living the Role."**

Philip DiConstanzo worked one-on-one with Albert Pia during the last years of Pia's life and produced an audio book of his lessons, exercises, and commentaries. "The idea of recording Al Pia's work came to me after reading his book, "Acting The Truth: The Acting Principles of Konstantin Stanislavski." I felt that, as good as the book was, it needed his voice to make the lessons come alive."

"We recorded over eighteen hours of material that took over a year to edit. During the editing period, I spent a great deal of time discerning these acting principles that deal with the inner life of the character and the circumstances therein. It became apparent that these lessons, exercises, and improvisations could easily and practically apply, not only to the stage, but also, usefully, to real life situations. The lessons and exercises are FUN to do and share with others."

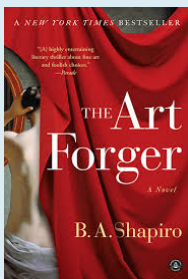

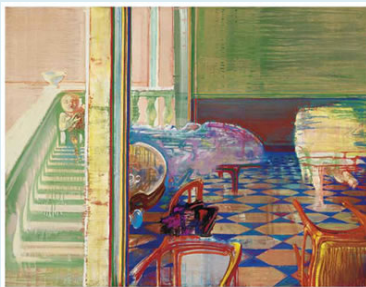

Leonardo Cremonini Exhibit
Quick Center for the Arts, Fairfield University

We will be visiting the Walsh Gallery at the Quick Center for the Arts to tour and view an exhibit of Leonardo Cremonini (1925-2010), "Timeless Monumentality: Paintings from The William Louis-Dreyfus Foundation."

Leonardo Cremonini was one of the preeminent Italian painters of the twentieth century. Widely admired, critically acclaimed, and technically accomplished, his works are to be found in the Museum of Modern Art in New York, the Hirschhorn Museum in Washington, D. C., the Musée d'Art Moderne, Centre Georges Pompidou in Paris, and numerous other public collections across Europe and the United States.

The tour will be given by the museum's director, Dr. Linda Wolk-Simon.
