- Four wonderful, tasty, well-decorated and well-attended Club Days and Programs
- Our Special Interest Groups have been bustling, busy and attracting new members
- So has Community Services, which received 59 community service grant applications and--for Thanksgiving and Christmas--disbursed through our Food Closet and Westport Human Services nearly \$12,000 in food gift certificates
- Our Community Services and Ways & Means fundraising initiatives are surging. Here are some quick "round" revenue numbers--for the FY period from Sept. 1 to the present--in which you can take pride:

Blues, Views & BBQ volunteers, \$1700 from **Westport DMA** for the Food Closet; **Curio Cottage**, \$7500 toward our CS grants and scholarships; **Rentals**, over \$12,000; **ENCORE! Clothing Sale**, \$4509 in revenues and \$3500 in donations of leftover clothing & jewelry; **Talbots** shopping fundraiser, \$418 (including \$95 for the hostess drawing); **Mah Jongg**, \$111 in card order rebates; **Garden Dept.** \$187 from

Club Day Drawing to the Food Closet, plus Holiday Plants for shut-ins (funded by their December Sale); **Nutcracker Tea**, \$1500 for Waltersville Elementary; **Children's Connection Toy Drive**, \$1100 in toys, checks and gift certificates; **In the Mood Dinner Dance**, \$1680 toward acoustical panels for Bedford Hall.

Annual Giving is still in progress! SPECIAL THANKS to those who have sent donations to Annual Giving or made decisions about bequests or commitments to our planned **Silent Auction fundraiser in Spring, 2016. NOTE: there's still time to add your gift or pledge!** The need is real. As you know, our major capital improvements over the past year:

- **Bedford Hall ceiling renovation** (new tiles, LED lights, Electrical, AV System, HVAC and paint, **along with attractive new acoustical panels, to be installed in January**, which will absorb 85% of mid-to-high frequency sound and eliminate echoes and reverberations) and
- **bringing our fire escape, 3rd floor roof, deck and exit doors up to fire and building codes**

have cost substantial funds from our endowment, so we now are working to replenish that capital and/or offset those costs.

- **Proceeds from 2015 Annual Giving** (unrestricted gifts), **In the Mood** and **our planned 150th Birthday Bash for Bedford Hall all will go to that purpose.**

Speaking of 2016! Please add these important dates to your calendars: **CLUB DAYS** (reservations due the Wed. before) on 2/1, 3/7, 4/4, 5/2 and 6/6. YDF Planning Meetings are the Wed. after Club Day. **Ways & Means** meets monthly on the 3rd Wed. morning. **Community Services**--which decides how much and to whom we give our grants and scholarships--meets monthly on the 4th Tuesday.

Upcoming special events: Installation of our **new Acoustical Panels** in Bedford Hall (January); **Valentine's Day Dinner-Dance on Sat. Feb. 13;** **Bedford Hall 150th Birthday Bash/Fundraiser** (mid-April?); **Art Show**, April 30-May 2; **Yankee Doodle Fair** set-up, June 13 and Fair, June 16-19.
